## Candidates For President

#### Republican Party

Former President Donald Trump - Presidential Candidate, Ohio Senator JD Vance -Vice-Presidential candidate.

#### Independent Candidates

Robert F. Kennedy Jr. (nephew of the U.S. president John F. Kennedy) withdrew in August, endorsing Trump.

# Democratic Party

Vice President Kamala Harris - Presidential Candidate, Minnesota Governor Tim Walz -Vice-Presidential candidate.





# What Do Democrats and Republicans Stand For?

#### Democrats

A liberal party supporting civil rights, social safety nets, and climate action. Issues highlighted by Kamala Harris include tackling the cost-of-living crisis and supporting abortion rights.

#### Republicans

A conservative party advocating for lower taxes, limited government, and gun rights. Donald Trump's campaign focused on tackling illegal immigration and lowering inflation to "make America affordable again."






## Party Symbols



#### **Democratic Donkey**

First used in 1828 when opponents called Andrew Jackson a "jackass" for his populist views. Popularized in 1870 by political cartoonist **Thomas Nast.** 

Adopted for traits like **humility**, **endurance** and **hard work**.



#### Republican Elephant

Originated in an 1874 cartoon by

Thomas Nast. Represents Republican values of small government and personal responsibility.

Symbolizes **strength**, **intelligence** and **determination**.



# How Does the U.S. Presidential Election Work?

#### Electoral College System

The winner isn't based on the popular vote but on winning **270 of the 538** electoral votes or electors across 50 states.

## State-by-State Contests

Each state has a set number of electoral votes, mostly awarded to the state's popular vote winner. Electors then cast one vote each in the Electoral College.

## Popular Vote vs. Electoral Vote

It is possible for a candidate to win the most votes nationally – like Hillary Clinton did in 2016 – but still be defeated due to the majority needed in the Electoral College System.

#### **Battleground States**


Only about seven key "swing" states decide the election outcome, as most states consistently lean toward one party.



## Swing States

Arizona, Georgia, Michigan, Nevada, North Carolina, Pennsylvania and Wisconsin - are thought to hold the keys to the

White House. Together, these states have a total of **88 electoral votes**. These votes are crucial since they can determine the overall outcome due to their competitive nature.





### **Fun Facts**

#### **Historic Comeback**

Donald Trump became the second U.S. president, after Grover Cleveland, to serve non-consecutive terms since 1897.

#### **Record Voter Turnout**

The 2024 election saw unprecedented voter participation, with over 160 million Americans casting their ballots.

#### **Midnight Voting Tradition**

Dixville Notch, a small New Hampshire town, is the first to vote at midnight, resulting in a tie, each receiving 3 votes.

#### **Celebrity Endorsements**

High-profile figures, including musicians and actors, actively endorsed candidates.





### Fun Facts

#### **Popular Vote**

Trump received 74 million votes (50.8%), and Harris got 67 million votes (47.5%).

#### **Early Voting**

Over 100 million votes were cast before Election Day through early and mail-in voting, accounting for more than 60% of the total votes.

#### Youth Voter Engagement

Voter turnout among individuals aged 18-29 increased by 8% compared to the 2020 election.

#### Campaign Expenditures

Combined spending by both campaigns exceeded \$5 billion, making it one of the most expensive elections in U.S. history.
